Tuition & Fees

The amount for Tuition & Fees is based on \$2.92 per hour in state and out of state \$11.16 per hour. 900-clock hours per school year.

Books, Supplies, and Lab Fees

Represent an average cost for OTC Programs using the highest lab fee charge and allotment of \$1,000 for a laptop. Program's Books & Supply list is supplied by the instructor.

Food & Housing

FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION

Financial Aid is any grant, scholarship, or paid employment offer to help a student meet his/her post-secondary educational expenses. Such aid is usually provided by various sources such as federal and state agencies, colleges, high schools, foundations, and corporations. The amount of financial aid that a student receives is determined through federal, state and institutional guidelines and may be awarded from one or any combination of sources. Aid received from grants and scholarships need not be repaid. Sources of financial aid at Okaloosa Technical College include the Federal Pell Grant, Florida Student Assistant Grant, Florida Bright Futures Scholarship, Veterans' Affairs Education Benefits, Work Force Innovation and Opportunity Act Scholarship (WIOA), and various other institutional and private scholarships.

Net Cost

A college's net price is an estimate of how much you and your family will pay out of pocket for education expenses for one school year. The net price is calculated by taking the total Cost of Attendance (Table shown above)— including tuition, food and housing and books— and subtracting any grants and scholarships you're eligible for.

Accept or Decline of Financial Aid Offer

Those students who do not accept the Student Financial Aid Offer may decline; however, all school fees will be the responsibility of the student and must be paid by the first day of class. If the offer is accepted, your Financial Aid advisor will provide next steps.

Drop/Add Period

The drop/add period is considered the first four school days at the beginning of each academic semester at OTC. Students must officially withdraw from the program with the registrar during the drop/add period or the student is responsible for the tuition accrued during the period of enrollment.
